WHAT IS RELIGIOUS FREEDOM?

Religious freedom includes two important aspects - freedom from and freedom for. "Freedom from" is probably familiar and what most of us think of as freedom. It means that we are to be free from coercion. The state is not an all-powerful institution that can force people to act against their consciences.

The right to be free from coercion limits the power of the state. But this freedom must be paired with a "freedom for," a positive orientation to seeking and acting in accordance with the truth. People and institutions have both a right and a duty to seek religious truth. Freedom from coercion allows the space for the pursuit of religious truth.


Religious freedom requires that a society both refrain from preventing people from living out their religion and help to create the conditions for religious expression to flourish. A free society, then, is one where people actively seek religious truth and fully live out that truth in public and private. As Pope Francis recently said, the Church must have "the freedom and all the means needed to bring the proclamation of the Kingdom to the existential peripheries of society."
