

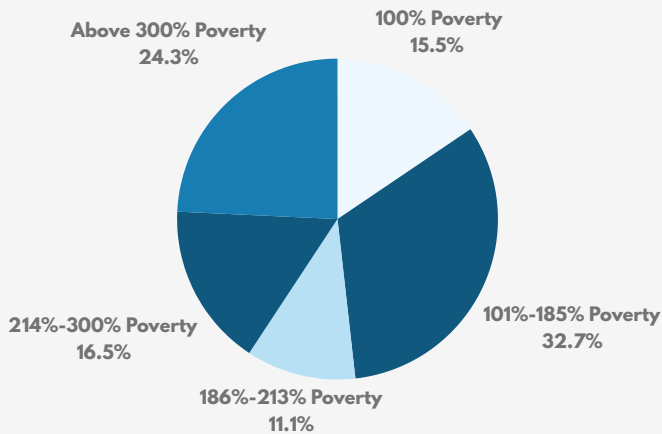

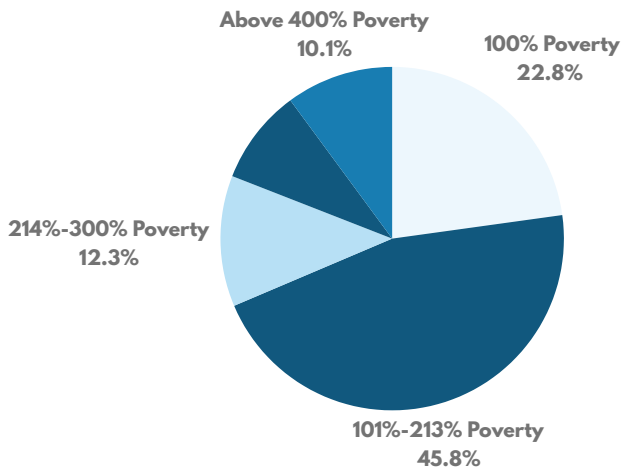
IMPACT REPORT

In 2024, a supermajority of Nebraska Legislators passed LB1402, a \$10M scholarship program funded by a state appropriation and administered by the State Treasurer. Treasurer Briese partnered with OSN to implement the program quickly and efficiently for Nebraska families in need. Unfortunately, special interest groups and opponents of education choice for families led to the repeal of the Nebraska Education Scholarship Program. But in just a few short months, the program was a beacon of hope for nearly 4,000 children.

STUDENT FAMILY INCOME



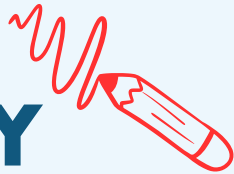
